- learn how to leverage Web2.0 technologies for your projects

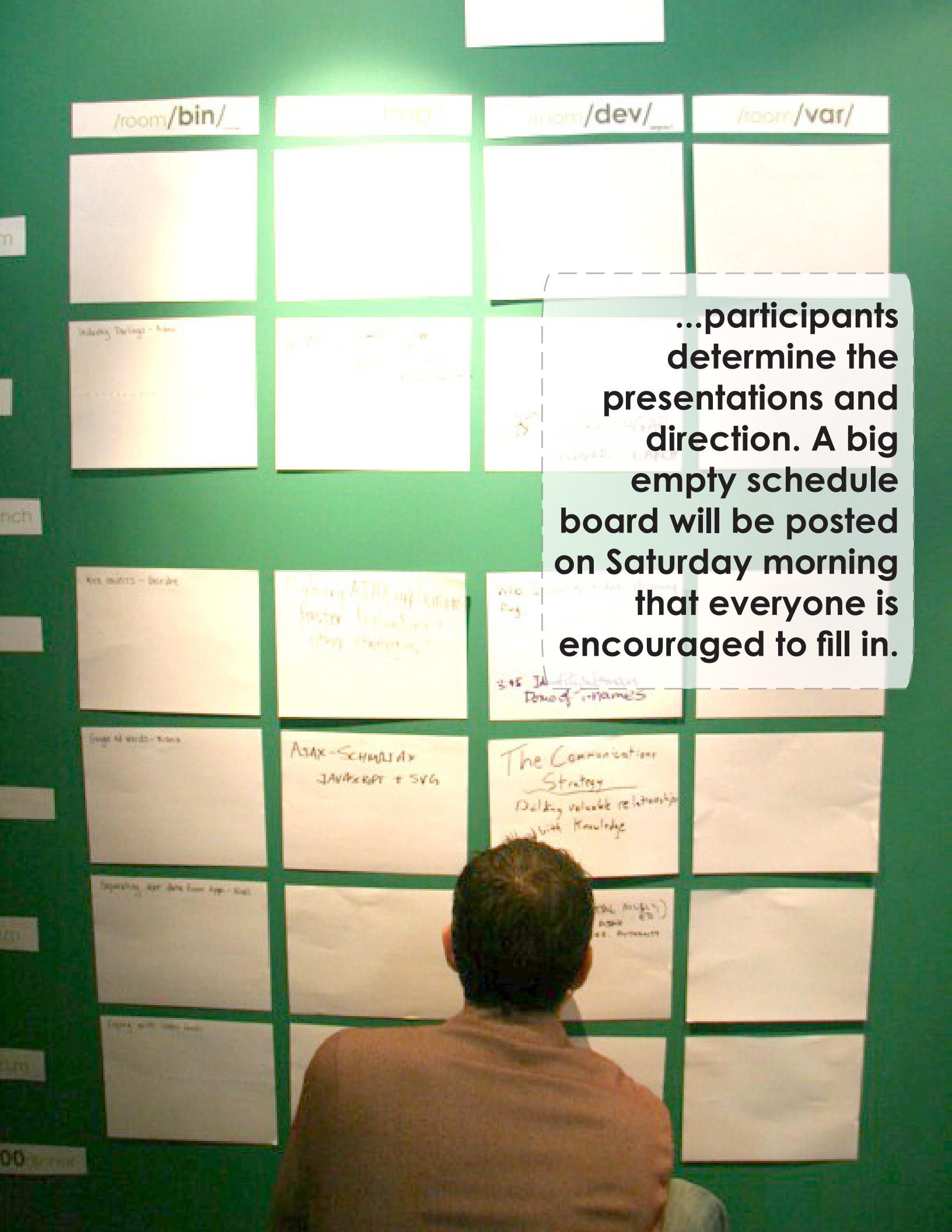
developers

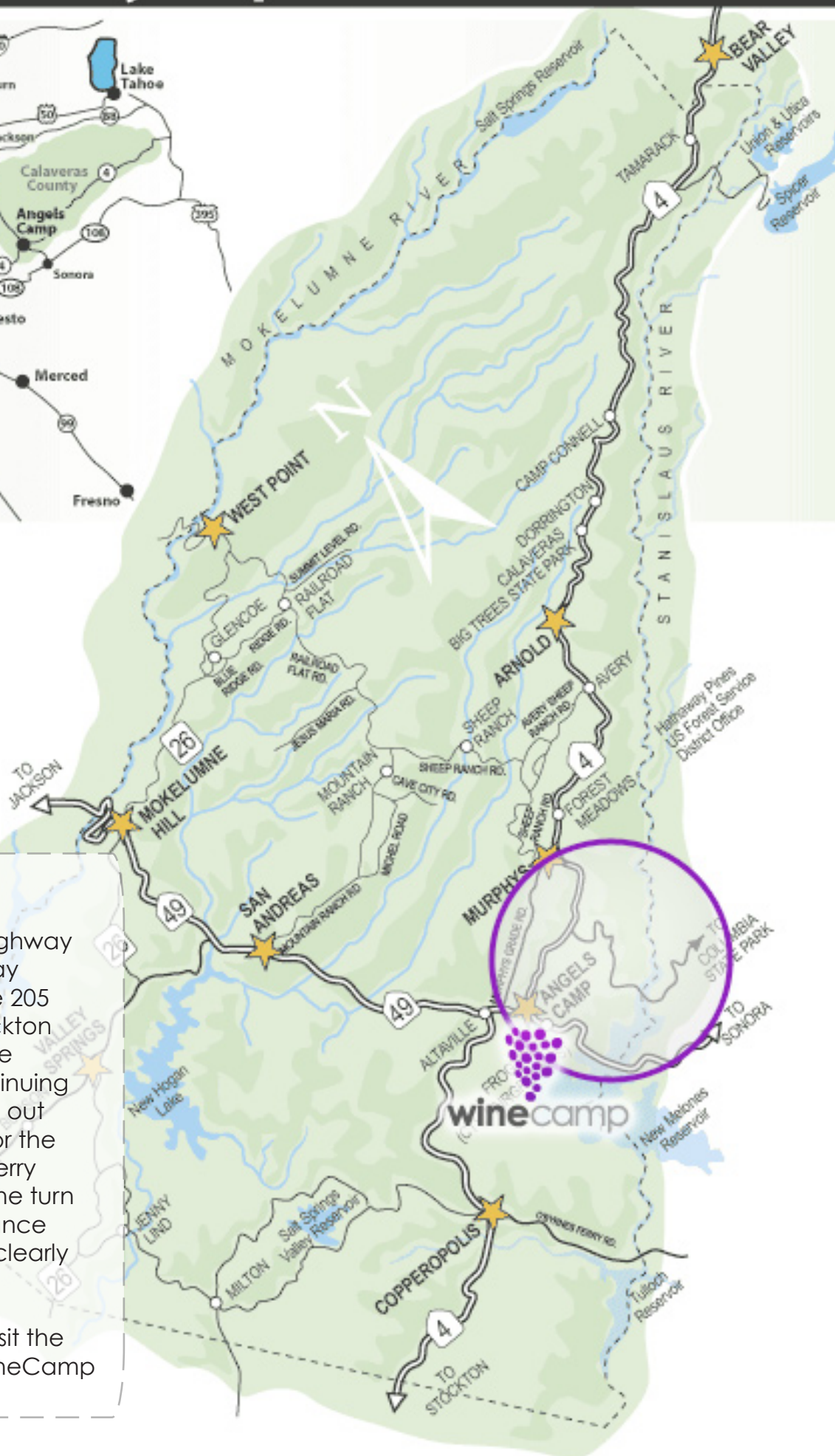

How to get there:

From San Francisco - Take Highway 280 North. Turn off on Highway 580 east to Tracy, then to the 205 east, then to 99 north to Stockton (then Highway 4 again). Drive through Angel's Camp, continuing on Highway 4. Almost 4 miles out of town, you will see a sign for the Moaning Cavern (Parrott's Ferry Road). Take that road past the turn off for the caverns. The entrance to the vineyard road will be clearly marked for you to enter.

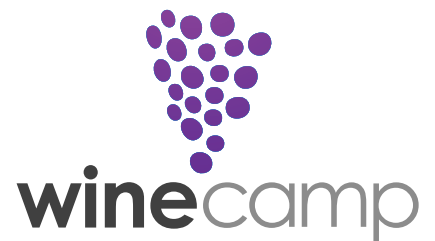
